## **PRECAUTIONS**



#### TO AVOID POSSIBLE OVER-EXPOSURE TO MICROWAVE ENERGY

- (A) Do not attempt to operate the oven with the door open, because it may cause harmful exposure to microwave energy. Do not disable the safety interlocks, or attempt to circumvent them.
- (B) Do not place anything between the front surface of the oven and the door or allow dirt or detergent residue to gather on sealing surfaces.
- (C)Do not operate the oven if it is damaged. It is particularly important that the oven door is properly closed and that there is no damage to:
- (1)
- DOOR (dent) HINGES AND LOCKS (broken or loose) (2)
- DOOR SEALS AND THE SEALING SURFACE
- (D) Any adjustments or repairs should only be entrusted to the manufacturer's properly qualified service personnel.

# SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE



#### READ CAREFULLY AND KEEP FOR FUTURE REFERENCE

- 1. WARNING: When the appliance is used in a combined mode, children can use the microwave oven only under adult supervision due to the high temperatures generated;
  2. WARNING: If the door or door seals are damaged, the oven must not be used until it is repaired by a
- qualified technician:
- 3. WARNING: Performing any maintenance or repairs which require removing any shielding protecting against microwave energy is dangerous and should only be entrusted to a qualified technician;
- 4. WARNING: Liquids and other foodstuffs may not be heated in sealed containers as the containers could explode:
- 5. WARNING: This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children unless they are aged from 8 years and above and supervised.

  6.The minimum required clearance above the top of the microwave oven is on the installation manual;
- 7. Use only cookware that is suitable for use in microwave ovens;
- 8. When heating food in plastic or paper containers, pay special attention to the microwave oven as containers may ignite;
- 9. If you see smoke, turn off the appliance or unplug it from power and keep the door closed until the flames are smothered:
- 10. Microwave heating of beverages can cause delayed boiling, therefore care should be taken when handling the container;

- 11. The contents of feeding bottles and jars with food for children should be stirred or shaken and the temperature checked before serving to prevent burns;
  12. Eggs in the shell and whole hard-boiled eggs should not be heated in microwave ovens since they could explode even after the microwave heating;
  13) For details on how to clean door seals and adjacent parts please refer to relevant section of this

14) The oven must be cleaned regularly. Remove any deposits of food and leftovers;
15) Neglecting to keep the oven clean can damage the surface, which may adversely affect the durability of the appliance and cause dangerous situations;
16) Important! If the power cord is damaged, it should be replaced by the manufacturer or specialist repair centre or a qualified person in order to avoid danger.
17) Before using the oven, test heat the grill heater (smoke can be given off through ventilation grid):

• Switch on the ventilation in the room or open a window,
• Set the oven to heat the grill heater only for about 3 minutes without heating food.

18) Keep the appliance and its cord out of reach of children less than 8 years;
19) This appliance is intended to be used in household and similar applications such as\*:

-staff kitchen areas in shops, offices and other working environments;
-farm houses;

-fárm houses

-bed and breakfast type environments.

20) WARNING: The appliance and its accessible parts become hot during use. Care should be taken to avoid touching heating elements. Children less than 8 years of age shall be kept away unless continuously

## SAFETY



- Oven must be placed on flat a surface
- 2. Turntable and rotating ring assembly should bein the oven during cooking. Carefully put cooked food on the turntable, and handle it carefully to avoid any breakage.

3. Improper use of the browning plate may cause cracking of the turntable due to the high temperature.

4. Only use bags for cooking in microwave ovens, which are correct size.

- 5. Microwave oven has several in-built circuit breakers to prevent emission of radiation, while the door is open. Do not tamper with these circuit breakers.
- 6. Do not operate the oven when empty. Operating the oven without food or dish with very low water content may result in fire, carbonization, arcing and damage to the internal chamber shell.
- 7. Do not cook food directly on the turntable. Excessive local heating of turntable may cause its rupture. 8. Do not heat baby bottles or baby food in the microwave. Uneven heating may occur and cause physical
- 9. Do not use narrow-necked containers such as bottles for syrups.

10. Do not fry in deep fat in the microwave.

- 11. Do not do home canning in a microwave oven because not always the entire contents of pot reaches boiling point.
- 12. Do not use microwave oven for commercial purposes. This microwave oven is designed for household
- 13. In order to avoid delayed boiling of hot liquids and beverages and the risk of burns, stir the liquid before placing the container in the oven and again in the middle of cooking time. Then leave the container in the oven for a short time and stir again before removing from oven chamber.
- 14. Do not forget that there is a dish in the microwave oven to avoid burning due to excessive cooking.
- 15. When the appliance is used in a combined mode, children can use the microwave oven only under adult supervision due to the high temperatures generated;
- 16. Neglecting to keep the oven clean can damage the surface, which may adversely affect the durability of the appliance and cause dangerous situations:
- 17. This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with physical, mental or sensory handicaps, or by those who are inexperienced or unfamiliar with the appliance, unless under supervision or in accordance with the instructions as communicated to them by persons responsible for their safety.



To reduce the risk of fire, injury to people or exposure to excessive microwave energy when using the appliance, please observe the following basic safety rules:

- Read the user manual before using the appliance.
- 2. Observe all "PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES TO AVOID POSSIBLE OVER-EXPOSURE TO MICROWAVE
- 3. As with most ovens, close supervision is needed to reduce the risk of fire inside the oven chamber.

### If ignition occurs:

- 1. Leave the oven door closed.
- 2. Switch off the appliance and pull out the plug from the wall socket
- 3. Disconnect the power by removing or disconnecting the fuse on the distribution board.



#### Always bear in mind the following principles:

- Do not overcook dishes. Carefully observe the appliance when paper, plastic or other combustible materials are inserted into the oven in order to facilitate cooking.
- 2. Do not use the oven for storage. Do not store combustible items inside the oven, such as bread, biscuits, paper products, etc. If lightning strikes in the supply line microwave may switch on automatically.
- 3. Remove the wire clamps and metal fixtures from containers / paper or plastic bags before placing them in the oven.
- 4. Microwave oven must be grounded. Only connect to a wall socket with the proper protective conductor. See "Installing the protective circuit."
- 5. Install or position the oven strictly in accordance with the instructions.
- 6. Some products, such as whole eggs, water, oil or grease, sealed containers and closed glass jars may explode and therefore should not be heated in the oven.
- 7. Use this appliance only for its intended purpose as described in the manual. Do not use corrosive chemicals in the appliance. Oven is specifically designed for heating or cooking food. It is not intended for industrial or laboratory use.
- 8. Operating the microwave oven should be done with adult supervision at all times. Do not allow children to play with the appliance or have access to the controls.
- be play with the appliance of make access to the controls.

  9. Do not operate the oven when its terminal strip or plug is damaged, it is not working properly, or if it has been damaged or dropped.
- 10. The appliance should be serviced only by qualified manufacturer service technicians.
- 11. Do not cover or block the air vents on the oven.
- 12. Do not store or use the oven outdoors.
- 13. Do not use the microwave oven near water, near the kitchen sink, in a damp room or near a swimming pool.
- 14. Do not immerse the power cord or plug in water.
- 15. Keep cord away from heated surfaces.
- 16. Do not allow the connection cord hanging over the edge of a table or counter.
- 17. Cleaning
- Before cleaning, make sure the oven is disconnected from the power source.
- a) After use, clean the inside of the oven using a slightly damp cloth.
- b) Clean the accessories in the normal way in soapy water.
- c) Dirty door frame, seal and adjacent elements should be cleaned gently with a damp cloth. When cleaning the surface of the oven door, use only mild soap or detergent applied with a sponge or soft cloth.
- 18. Do not use harsh abrasive cleaners or sharp metal scrapers to clean the oven door glass since they can scratch the surface, which may result in shattering of the glass.
- 19. Cleaning Tip---For easier cleaning of the cavity walls that the food cooked can touch: Place half a lemon in a bowl, add 300ml (1/2 pint) water and heat on 100% microwave power for 10 minutes. Wipe the oven clean using a soft, dry cloth.

### UNPACKING



The appliance was protected from damage at the time of transport. After unpacking, please dispose of all elements of packaging in a way that will not cause damage to the environment. All materials used for packaging the appliance are environmentally friendly; they are 100% recyclable and are marked with the appropriate symbol.

Important! Packaging materials (bags, polyethylene, polystyrene, etc.) should be kept away from children during unpacking.

### WITHDRAWAL FROM USE

## INSTALLING THE PROTECTIVE CIRCUIT


#### DANGER

Danger of electric shock when

touched, some internal components may cause serious injury or death. Do not disassemble this appliance.

#### WARNING

Electric shock hazard. Improper use of earthing can cause electric shock. Do not insert the plug into the socket before the appliance is properly installed and grounded.



This appliance must be grounded. In the event of a short-circuit, earthing reduces the risk of electric shock. The appliance is equipped with earthing wire with an appropriate plug. The plug should be inserted into a properly installed and grounded outlet.

If you do not completely understand earthing instruction or you are unsure whether the appliance is properly grounded, please contact a qualified electrician or service technician. If you must use an extension cord, use only a three-wire extension with an earthing connector. The manufacturer shall not be liable for damage or injury resulting from connecting the microwave oven to a power source without a protective circuit or with a malfunctioning protection circuit.

- A short power cord is provided to reduce the risk resulting from becoming entangled or tripping over a long cord.
- 2. If you use the extension cord:

  1) Extension cord must be capable of withstanding nominal current required by the appliance.

  2) Extension cord must be 3-wire with earthing,

Extension cord should be so arranged as not to be hung by the table top where it could be pulled by children, or caught inadvertently.

# **COOKWARE**

#### WARNING



Risk of injury. Tightly closed containers may explode. Closed containers must be opened and plastic bags pierced before cooking.

Materials that can be used and materials to be avoided in the microwave oven.

The use of some non-metallic cookware may not be safe in the microwave oven. If in doubt, you can check the cookware following this procedure.

### Testing the cookware:

- 1. Fill the microwave-safe cookware with 1 cup of cold water (250 ml), and do the same with the test cookware.
- 2. Operate the oven with the maximum power for 1 minute.
- 3. Carefully touch the test cookware. If the test cookware is hot, do not use it in the microwave oven.
- 4. Do not exceed 1 minute cooking time.

# **COOKWARE**

# Materials that cannot be used in a microwave oven

Cookware	Comments
Aluminium tray	May cause an electric arc. Transfer food to microwave-safe cookware.
Cardboard carton with metal handle	May cause an electric arc. Transfer food to microwave-safe cookware.
Metal or cookware with metal frame	Metal shields the food from microwave energy. Metal frame can cause an electric arc.
Metal closure - tightened	May cause an electric arc and fire in the oven.
Paper bags	May cause a fire in the oven.
Plastic foam	Plastic foam may melt or contaminate the liquid in it when exposed to high temperatures.
Wood	Wood dries out when it is heated in the microwave oven and can crack or break.

# Materials that can be used in a microwave oven

Cookware	Comments
Aluminium foil	Only as shielding. Small and smooth pieces can be used for the coating of thin pieces of meat or poultry, to prevent excessive cooking. Arc discharge may occur if the foil is too close to the oven walls. Film must be at least at a distance of 2.5 cm from the oven walls.
Browning plate	Observe the manufacturer's instructions. The bottom of the browning plate must be at least 5 mm above the turntable. Improper use may cause cracking of the turntable.
Dinner dishes	Suitable for microwave ovens only. Observe the manufacturer's instructions. Do not use cracked or chipped cookware.
Glass jars	Always remove the lid. Use only for heating food to a suitable temperature. Most glass jars are not heat resistant and may explode.
Glassware	Use only heat-resistant glassware in the microwave oven. Make sure that there are no metal frames. Do not use cracked or chipped cookware.
Bags for microwave cooking	Observe the manufacturer's instructions. Do not seal with metal clamps.
Paper plates and cups	Cut through to allow the steam to escape. Use only for short cooking / heating. Do not leave the oven unattended while cooking.
Paper towels	Use to cover food to be heated to absorb fat. Use only for short cooking under constant surveillance.
Parchment paper	Use as a cover to prevent splashing or as a container for evaporation.
Plastics	Suitable for microwave ovens only. Should be labelled "for use in microwave ovens." Some plastic containers soften when the content is warmed up. Bags for microwave cooking and sealed plastic bags must be pierced or incised, or vented according to the directions on the package.
Plastic packaging	Suitable for microwave ovens only. Use to cover food during cooking in order to maintain moisture. Do not let plastic packing touch the food.
Thermometers	Suitable for microwave ovens only (thermometers for meat and sugar).
Wax paper	Used as a covering to prevent splashing and to keep moisture.

# SETTING UP YOUR MICROWAVE OVEN

### Microwave oven accessories

Remove all packaging, both inside and outside the oven, before using the oven. The oven comes with the following accessories:



A) Control panel B, C) Spindle


D) Turntable

G) System security lock - disconnects power to the oven when the door is opened during operation.



# **TURNTABLE INSTALLATION**



- Never compress or place the turntable upside down.
- 2. When cooking always use the turntable and its ring support. 3. For cooking or heating always put the food on the turntable.
  - If the turntable breaks, please contact manufacturer service.
- Equipment:
- 1. Grilling rack
- Turnable glass
   Spindle
- \* Note: The grilling rack supplied with the appliance should only be used when the appliance is set to "GRILL".

## INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

- Remove all packaging materials and components.
- Check the oven for damage such as dents or door misalignment or breakage.
- Remove any protective film from the surface of the cabinet.
- Do not install the oven if it is damaged.



Do not remove the light brown mica cover bolted into the recess in order to shield the microwave magnetron.

### Installing

- 1. The appliance is designed for household use only.
- 2. The appliance can be used only after fitting in kitchen furniture.
- 3. For fitting instructions, please refer to "Installation guide".
- 4. Microwave oven should be installed in a cabinet with a width of 60 cm and a height of 85 cm from the kitchen floor.

Do not remove the legs located in the bottom of the appliance.

Blocking the inlet and outlet openings may damage the microwave oven. Place the oven as far away from radio and television as possible. Operating microwave oven may cause interference to radio and television reception.

2. Insert the oven power plug into a standard household wall socket. Make sure beforehand whether voltage and frequency are the same as on the oven's rating plate.

Accessible surfaces may become hot during oven operation.




This microwave oven has a modern electronic programmer to adjust the parameters of cooking or reheating.

# 1. Setting current time

Once the microwave oven is plugged into the outlet, the display shows 00:00. Proceed as follows:

- 1. Press minute digits start to flash
- 2. Turn to set the hour
- 3. Press | minute digits start to flash
- 4. Turn to set the minutes
- 5. Press 5 to store current time setting



# 2. Heating food

Example: If you want to cook food for 20 minutes using 80% of maximum microwave power, the oven can be set as follows:

- 1. Press 🗓 🐰 / DK , the screen displays "PI 00".
- 2. Press preparedly or turn to set microwave power equal to 80%, the display will show "P80" (the microwave power is marked with the appropriate symbol shown in the table on the next page).
- 3. Press | ① + ¾ / DK | to confirm.
- 4. Turn to select the cook time of 20 minutes.
- 5. Press 🛈 + 🚻 / DK to start heating or 🔯 to cancel settings.

Note: Time can be adjusted with different resolution for individual cook

time ranges:

0---1 min: 5 seconds 1---5 min: 10 seconds 5---10 min: 30 seconds 10---30 min: 1 minute 30---95 min: 5 minutes

# 3. Grilling



**NOTE:** Special rack which is supplied with the oven can only be used during grilling.

- 1. Press | , the screen displays "PI 00".
- 2. Press repeatedly  $\| \mathcal{E} \|$  or rotate  $\mathcal{E}$ , to set the Grill function (indicated on the display as "G").
- 3. Press O + 2 / DK to confirm the selection of the grill function.
- 4. Turn to set the cook time (ranging from 00:05 to 95:00).
- 5. Press ⊕ + 2 / DK to start grilling.

**Note:** Once half of the grilling time has elapsed, an acoustic signal will be sounded to indicate that the food should be turned to obtain better cooking result. Open the door, turn the food and press  $| \bigcirc + \mathbb{A} / \square \times |$  to resume cooking. If this is not done, the appliance will continue to operate until the set cook time has elapsed.

# 4. Combined heating

Combined use of grill and microwave cooking in the appropriate proportions (see C-1 and C-2 table below).

- 1. Press | , the screen displays "PI 00".
- 2. Press repeatedly or rotate to set the Combi function indicated on the display as "C-1" or "C-2" (the ratio of microwave to the grill power is presented in the following table).
- 3. Press | ① + 과 / DK | to confirm the selection of the Combi function.
- 4. Turn to set the cook time (ranging from 00:05 to 95:00).
- 5. Press | ⊕ + 孙 / □ κ | to start the appliance.

# 5. Quick Start

Use this feature to quickly start cooking food. Once the food is placed in the microwave oven press | ① + 孙 / □ K | again and again to add cook time and start cooking. Using the Quick Start function you can set a cook time of 30 seconds to 10 minutes. Food is then cooked at maximum power.

# 6. Defrosting by weight

- 1. Press button once, the display shows "dEF1" (defrosting by weight).
- 2. Turn to adjust the weight of food (in the range 100-2000g).
- 3. Press 🛈 + 🚻 / DK to start the defrosting process.

# 7. Defrosting by time

- 1. Press button twice, the display shows "dEF2" (defrosting by time).
- 2. Turn to set the cook time (ranging from 00:05 to 95:00).
- 3. Press | ① + 孙 / DK | to start the defrosting process.

## 8. Multi-stage cooking

Set the cooking programme. Three power levels can be set. Defrosting should be always set first, if it is included in a multi-step programme. The appliance will beep after each programme step has been completed. Auto Menu cannot be used in multi-step cooking.

**Example:** To defrost food for 5 minutes, then cook it for 7 minutes using 80% microwave power, do the following:

- 1. Press the button twice (the display shows "dEF2.)
- 2. Turn to set the defrosting time for 5 minutes.
- 3. Press | | , the screen displays "PI 00".
- 4. Turn to set the microwave power of 80% (the display will show "P80").
- 5. Press □ + ₩ / DK to confirm.
- 6. Turn to select the cook time of 7 minutes.
- 7. Press | ① + 孙 / DK | to start the appliance.

# 9. Preset programmes

**Example:** If you want to use the "Auto Menu" to prepare 250 g of fish.

- 1. Turn clockwise to select the "A3" function
- 2. Press | ① + 孙 / DK | to confirm the selected preset programme.
- 3. Turn to select the weight of 250g.
- 4. Press | ⊕ + № | to start the preset programme.
- 5. Microwave beeps after cooling is finished.

### 10. Child lock

To activate child lock: Press the of for about 3 seconds until the display shows and a long beep is heard - the child lock is activated. To deactivate child lock: Press the of for about 3 seconds until the display shows and a long beep is heard - the child lock is deactivated.

### 11. Information functions:

- a) Press | e | during cooking to show the current power level.
- b) Press  $| \oplus + \mathbb{R} / \oplus \mathbb{K} |$  to resume cooking after the door is opened and closed.
- d) Press  $\left| \frac{G}{G_{r}} \right|$  during cooking to show the current time.

### 12. Timer

- 1. Press  $| {}^{\mbox{\tiny $G$}}_{\mbox{\tiny $G$}}|$  button twice, the display shows "00:00".
- 2. Turn to set the time (ranging from 00:05 to 95:00).
- 3. Press To start.



Time function is not connected with any of product's function. The function serves only in order to signal time end up.

# 13. Cleaning

Make sure the oven has been disconnected from power.

- 1. Clean the inside of the oven after use with a lightly moistened cloth.
- 2. Clean accessories in the usual manner with soap and water.
- 3. If soiled, door frame, gasket and adjacent parts should be thoroughly cleaned with a damp cloth.

## TROUBLESHOOTING

Microwave oven interferes with the TV reception	Radio and television reception may be disrupted when the microwave oven operates. The same applies to small household appliances such as a blender, vacuum cleaner and electric fan. This is normal.
Dimmed oven lighting.	When cooking with low microwave power, oven light may be dimmer. This is normal.
Condensation forms on the door, hot air comes out through vents.	When cooking, steam can be released from food. Most of the steam escapes through the vents. However some steam can collect in the form of condensation on cooler parts, such as oven door. This is normal.

Fault	Possible cause	How to correct
	(1) power cord unplugged or not plugged properly into the socket	Pull the plug and put it back in after 10 seconds.
Oven does not start.	(2) Blown fuse or tripped circuit breaker.	Replace the fuse or turn on the circuit breaker (contact manufacturer service)
	(3) No voltage in the socket	Check the outlet by plugging in other appliance.
The oven does not heat.	The door is not closed properly.	Close the door fully.
Turntable makes noise when oven operates	Rotating ring or bottom of the oven dirty.	See "Microwave oven maintenance"

# FINAL REMARKS



Before using the microwave, please carefully read this manual. Store it in such a place, so that it may be used in future. Do not repair the oven yourself, please contact manufacturer service. The contents of feeding bottles and jars with food for children should be stirred or shaken and the temperature checked before serving to prevent burns; Regularly check the oven and its power cord for damage. If there is any damage, do not use the oven

### WARNING:



- 1. Performing any maintenance or repairs which require removing any shielding protecting against microwave energy is dangerous and should only be entrusted to a qualified technician;
  2. Only give the child permission to use the oven without supervision when the child has been given appro-
- 2. Only give the child permission to use the oven without supervision when the child has been given appropriate guidance to use the microwave safely and is aware of the risks of misuse;
- If the power supply cable is damaged, it should be replaced by the manufacturer or at an authorized servicing outlet.



Do not attempt to operate the oven with the door open, because it may cause harmful exposure to microwave energy. <u>Do not disable the safety interlocks, or attempt to circumvent them.</u>

Thoroughly clean the door gasket and sealing surfaces. Do not operate the oven if it is damaged. It is particularly important that the oven door is properly closed and that there is no damage to: (1) door (bent), (2) hinges and latches (broken or loosened), (3) gaskets and the door sealing surface. Check cookware and make sure that it is suitable for use in microwave ovens.



When heating food in plastic or paper containers, pay special attention to the microwave oven as containers may ignite;

Microwave heating of beverages can cause delayed boiling, therefore care should be taken when handling the container;

## **CLEANING AND CARE**

- 1. Turn off the oven and remove the power plug from the wall socket before cleaning.
- 2. Keep the inside of the oven clean. When food splatters or spilled liquids adhere to oven walls, wipe with a damp cloth. Mild detergent may be used if the oven gets very dirty. Avoid the use of spray and other harsh cleaners as they may stain, streak or dull the door surface.
- 3. The outside surfaces should be cleaned with a damp cloth. To prevent damage to the operating parts inside the oven, water should not be allowed to seep into the ventilation openings.
- 4. Wipe the door and window on both sides, the door seals and adjacent parts frequently with a damp cloth to remove any spills or spatters. Do not use abrasive cleaner.
- 5. Do not allow the control panel to become wet. Clean with a soft, damp cloth. When cleaning the control panel, leave oven door open to prevent oven from accidentally turning on.
- 6. If steam accumulates inside or around the outside of the oven door, wipe with a soft cloth. This may occur when the microwave oven is operated under high humidity condition. And it is normal.
- 7. It is occasionally necessary to remove the glass tray for cleaning. Wash the tray in warm sudsy water or in a dishwasher.
- 8. The roller ring and oven floor should be cleaned regularly to avoid excessive noise. Simply wipe the bottom surface of the oven with mild detergent. The roller ring may be washed in mild sudsy water or dishwasher. When removing the roller ring from cavity floor for cleaning, be sure to replace in the proper position.
- 9. Remove odors from your oven by combining a cup of water with the juice and skin of one lemon in a deep microwaveable bowl, microwave for 5 minutes. Wipe thoroughly and dry with a soft cloth.
- 10. When it becomes necessary to replace the oven light, please consult a dealer to have it replaced.
- 11. The oven should be cleaned regularly and any food deposits removed. Failure to maintain the oven in a clean condition could lead to deterioration of the surface that could adversely affect the life of the appliance and possibly result in a hazardous.
- 12. Please do not dispose this appliance into the domestic rubbish bin; it should be disposed to the particular disposal center provided by the municipalities.
